Potwin PRIDE Inc. News

It is great to be writing the Potwin PRIDE Inc. news for the This Is Potwin newsletter again. We want to thank Tonya Taber, our new librarian, for producing the newsletter again.

We had several projects from last fall that I would like to report on.
We would like to thank those who took time to fill out the PRIDE survey the last week in
September. They will be tallied and results will be made known sometime later this year. A special
thanks to Sherri Wedel, Marcy Macy, and Sarah Colling for helping PRIDE members Dean Schmidt,
Alan Whiteside, and Melvina Jones.

18 people rode on the PRIDE float in the Watermelon Festival parade August 20, 2016. I would like to thank Cynthia and Solon Dawes and Catlin Mitchell for helping put the float together on Saturday morning after the rain.

About 60 people attended the National Night Out on October 4, 2016. We want to thank Wheat State Telephone for furnishing cider and water to drink and Sheriff Herzert and Deputy Curtis Cox for informing us of things we need to be aware of to protect us including several scams. Deputy Cox gave information about Reverse 911. He said all land lines have this service to warn of situations in our area. However, if you have only a cell phone and would like to have this service you need to call 316-320-1294 and give them your cell phone number.

We harvested 3,604 pounds of produce from the Ken Whittington Plant a Row for the Hungry Garden last year. We harvested 1,143 pounds of tomatoes and 601 pounds of turnips. On November 4, 11 adults and 18 youth dug 371 pounds of sweet potatoes. On November 17, we had a work day at



the garden instead of a meeting. 5 adults and 6 youth cleared the tomatoes and cages off of the garden. Dean Schmidt tilled the garden February 13, 2017 and Melvina took a soil sample to the Butler County Extension Office to find out if we need to add anything to the soil before we plant. We will plant potatoes around March 17 depending on the weather.

In December, the city put up the Christmas trees on the light poles that PRIDE made many years ago. The Lions Club put up and decorated a tree at the 4-way stop intersection and had Santa there on December 10. PRIDE furnished candy canes to 31 people

who came to see Santa. There were also 6 dogs who came.

The latest information from Dean on the ball light project is that the lights have been purchased with money from the Butler County Windfarm Grant, delivered, and ready to be put on the cross bars. Hopefully the lights can be put up this year. This is a joint project of the City of Potwin, Recreation committee, Potwin Lions Club, and Potwin PRIDE.

We have not had any PRIDE meetings this year since members have been ill. The next scheduled meeting would be March 16, at 7:00 PM at the Community house, but we may have a work night to cut potato seed for the garden at a different time. Anyone wishing to help with the garden this year or any other project should contact Melvina Jones at 620-752-3577 or Dean Schmidt at 620-752-3359.

The first 2017 motorcycle Sunday will be March 12. The youth at the First United Methodist Church of Potwin will be having a baked potato bar that day also in the church basement from 11:45 AM to 1:00 PM. Free will donation.
