1470 pounds of vegetables have been harvested at the Ken Whittington Memorial Garden this year. On July 6, 18

youth and 7 adults dug 538 pounds of potatoes. 453 pounds of corn was picked during July. So far this year we have picked 443 pounds of tomatoes and 37 pounds of cucumbers. We have been picking at 8:30 AM most Monday's and Thursday's and oftener for the corn so there have not been many who have been there to help.







I could usually count on the Dyck family, sometimes all of them or other times Henry, Anna, and Peter. On July 25 they pulled the first four rows of corn and then on July 31 they were joined by their cousins Corny, Willy, and Isaak to pull the last eight rows. They were the best corn pullers in Potwin. I want to thank them and all the other volunteers who have helped at the garden this summer.


