#### The Ball Light Project

The ball lights were an item, on many citizens of Potwin's wish list. It had been thought about, dreamed about, quoted, and drawn out. We all thought "How are we ever going to raise that amount of money?"

It all started August 8<sup>th</sup> 2010. The city of Potwin and the Potwin Lions Club decided to start a Motorcycle Sunday. The Lions Club was to put the money they made from this biker Sunday toward the "ball light project." This month, this Bike Run of ours has gone on for 7 years and one month.

With the help of Potwin PRIDE and Potwin Rec we were able to put a chain link fence all the way around our ball diamond. This was the start!

October of 2016, after countless orders of biscuits and gravy and hundreds upon thousands of WOOHOO's, our lights are delivered to our little town! We couldn't have done it without all the bikers who come and see us every second Sunday.

We have our lights, and thoughts of "What do we do now?" kick in. There was some work done to the ball fields, such as extending and putting a roof on the dugouts.

In June of 2017 we ordered the electrical hardware for all our lights, and the process of putting them up begins. Dean Schmidt- the Mayor of Potwin, Chuck Spencer- president of the Potwin REC Board, and Jared Ownbey- member of the Rec Board went down and looked at the poles that were donated by Westar Energy. They found 6 that were the same height and moved them to their appropriate spots around the ball field. Jared and a few of his coworkers graciously donated their time to wire up each of the 6 poles. After a few minor setbacks, we were ready to test the ball lights, and TA-DA they all worked! Goodness they were bright!

On Tuesday August 22<sup>nd</sup> 2017, Westar Energy had a bucket truck and a drilling truck come to the ball diamonds to place the poles for free! They got one pole in the ground no problem, the others not quite the same story. Westar set 2 poles on Tuesday as well as cut down the old lights. They returned Wednesday with a rock drilling bit and finished up the remaining 4 poles. Whew, the poles are in the ground and standing nice and tall! Jared and Mayor Dean took it upon themselves to make sure the lights were wired up and functioning for our Watermelon Festival Softball Tournament.

Thursday night, August 24<sup>th</sup> 2017, the ball lights in Potwin turned on for the 1<sup>st</sup> time in over 7 years.

To everyone involved in this project it was an unforgettable moment and a long time coming.

As all of this was going on let's not forget about the little projects. Jason Taylor volunteered his time to spray the concession stand, the underside of the bleachers and the roof. Sherri Wedel and J.B. Smith painted the top of the bleachers, dugout benches, and the trim on the concession stand. Terry Wedel worked the infield. Kathy Cherryholmes, John Cherryholmes, Jimmy Howell, and Sammy Smith helped put the roof on the dugouts and replace broken boards on the bleachers. Don Hoover mowed the outfield the week of the festival. Over all there was a total of 400 man hours donated. That itself shows how amazing this little town is!!!

The Potwin Lions Club, The Potwin Rec Board, The City of Potwin, and Potwin Pride would like to thank each and every one of you who volunteered time at the ball diamonds to help us make this dream of ours become a reality.

  - Weigh in will also be open the 16th in the evening
  - Fish weighed dead or alive. Dead fish will receive a 2oz. deduction penalty
  - For the non-fisherman There will also be a raffle and Calcutta auction to sponsor a team to win. The sponsor cost is a min of \$20, if more than one person wants to sponsor, it will go to auction. You can sponsor your own team. This will go into a separate pot and winner will receive 70% of the pot.

Congratulations to the Potwin Lions Club, city of Potwin, recreation committee, Westar, PRIDE, and all the other volunteers that made it possible to have the lights to use for the tournament at the Watermelon Festival.

2,689 pounds of vegetables have been harvested at the Ken Whittington Memorial Plant a Row for the Hungry Garden this year. 1,559 pounds of them have been tomatoes. On August 8, the Methodist Church Youth Group took tomatoes to the Open Doors food pantry in Wichita when they toured their new warehouse facility. On August 14, we picked 293 pounds of tomatoes. We had so many tomatoes that week that we took some to the Family Worship Center in El Dorado and they handed them out while they were handing out school supplies. We want to thank Ronnie and Nancy Jackson for continuing to take vegetables to the Salvation Army in Wichita.

We continue to have vegetables available for other people in the community at the Methodist Church garage for a free will donation. Check the bulletin board at the Post Office or drive by the garage to see which days they are available. This fall it will probably be on Tuesday and maybe another day.

About 65 people attended the National Night Out on August 8. We want to thank Sheriff Herzet and his officers for participating. The Dare officer handed out bags to the kids and Phil Wickwire from the Elks Club in El Dorado also handed out things for the kids to. We also want to thank those who furnished cakes and Wheat State Telephone for furnishing the drinks. We are planning a bigger event next year.

19 people participated in the float project for the Watermelon Festival parade. Most of them have participated in the garden project at some time. We would like to thank the committee that plans and puts on the Watermelon Festival each year. It really brings a lot of people to town.

Upcoming events in Potwin are the biker's Sunday September 10 and Old Peoples Day September 23. The next PRIDE meeting will be September 21 at 7:00 PM at the Community House.
