Greetings,

Over the past few months the Sheriff's Department has responded to an increasing number of dog related incidents in Potwin. These incidents range from barking dogs, to dogs running at large, to an increase in dog bite incidents. As the Sheriff's Department will more aggressively address these issues, I thought it might be a good idea to remind the residents of the Potwin City Ordinances on the books pertaining to dogs.

- 2-108 Every owner is responsible for removal of animal waste from public and private property.
- 2-201 Any dog kept or harbored within city limits must be licensed.
- 2-301 It is unlawful to permit any dog to run at large within the city of Potwin.
- 2-309 Nuisance or excessive barking is prohibited.
- 2-402 Dangerous animals are prohibited.
- 2-404 Pit Bull and Pit Bull breeds are prohibited in Potwin city limits.

This is just a brief overview of Potwin city ordinance pertaining to dogs. For a complete copy of animal related Potwin ordinances please contact me or see Sherri in the Potwin City building.

If your dog bites a non-family member you can expect to receive a citation. If your dog has a history of biting, the incident will be cited and set for a mandatory review by a Judge in Potwin Court. This could include fines ranging from \$100 to \$500.

Also, an excessive barking dog, especially at night, is a nuisance to all the families living around the animal. If a Deputy arrives on scene, and hears the barking himself, he can write a ticket to the dog's owner. If the dog is no longer barking when the Deputy arrives, the law requires a complainant who would be willing to attend court if necessary, before a citation can be issued. You may call in the problem and remain anonymous, however, that might mean no citation can be issued.

As a responsible animal owner it is your duty to ensure your animal(s) are properly cared for and kept safe. Additionally it is your responsibility to ensure others are kept safe from your animal(s). Every dog owner feels their animal is friendly as that's how the animal acts with the family. I can tell you from many years of experience with dogs, that is not always how they act when they are away from your direct supervision.

My goal here is compliance not ticket numbers. My hope is that we can work together to address this problem and make Potwin a safer, quieter community for everyone.
