Did you know?

According to Potwin City Ordinance No. 700, it is unlawful to litter in or on city streets, sidewalks, alleys, parks or other public right of ways in the city. This includes grass clippings blown into the street from your mower. Accumulation of the clippings leads to clogging in the city drains and causes flooding when it rains; this can be a real problem for the homes and businesses located near those drains. It is also against city code (Ch. 8, Article 2, Sections 8-401) to have weeds or indigenous grasses on residential property exceeding 12 inches, as these are considered a blighting influence.

The city limb pile out by the ball diamonds is for *limbs, logs, and wood with no nails only*. There is a sign as you enter the area with a list of what is not permitted. Recently there have been items such as tennis shoes, clothing, metal, wood with nails in it, and grass clippings in the pile. The pile is randomly spot checked by the state and the city could lose their permit for a burn pile if it contains items other than limbs, resulting in Potwin residents having to take all limbs to the county landfill.



With the 4th of July holiday approaching, here are a few important things for the city residents to be aware of: The discharge of fireworks within the city limits is permitted only on the following times and dates:

June 27th through July 3rd 10 a.m. – 10 p.m.

July 4th 10 a.m. – Midnight

July 5th 10 a.m. – 10 p.m.

July 6th 10 a.m. – 11 p.m.

All fireworks must be fired on private property.

Children under 10 years of age must have adult supervision.

JUST A REMINDER!

With the end of the school year, warm weather and longer daylight hours upon us, we would like to remind parents in Potwin that there is an enforced curfew. Children aged 16 and younger are not allowed to be on public property after 10:30 p.m. Sunday through Thursday and after 11:30 p.m. Friday and Saturday. This includes streets, parks, and sidewalks; on foot or in a vehicle.

ATTENTION!

Effective July 1, 2019, Butler County will be suspending the Recycle Trailer Program until further notice.

For the past year, it has become increasingly difficult to find markets for the recycled products that are collected through the Butler County Recycle Trailer Program. The main reason for this is foreign countries are no longer accepting recyclables from the United States.

This is not only a problem for Butler County and the City of El Dorado (who processes the recyclables for us), but a state and nationwide issue. The County is now paying more per ton to businesses that have taken our recyclables in the past than it costs to landfill those recyclables. As a result, the Butler County Commission made the decision to suspend the Recycle Trailer Program as of July 1, 2019.

Happy Summer!

June is my birthday month, so we like to get together and have a dinner, cake and ice cream.

One of my favorite memories of being little and having our own milk cows was we had a lot of homemade ice cream. We had a hand crank ice cream freezer and we would have to get block ice from the locker. (This was before you could get crushed ice in a bag!) Dad would put the ice block in a gunny sack, take the flat side of the ax, and smashed it into chunks. Then came the fun part, after Mom mixed the ice cream mixture, poured it into the ice cream bucket, then Dad would take it and put it in the ice bucket. All the ice and salt was added and towels were put on top of the crank and I got to sit on the bucket to hold it down. When the ice cream started getting hard, the crank was harder and harder to turn, so it needed extra weight to keep it from moving. Sometimes my sister JoAnn and I would sit on it together. When Dad couldn't turn it anymore, Mom would pack it in ice, and Dad would get the dasher in a bowl and get the first lick. This is the old-fashioned recipe, before we got so scared of raw eggs. My Mom had a 6 qt. freezer, so you could adjust it down to fit a 4 qt. or even a 2 qt. freezer.

In mixer, beat 9 eggs til frothy and yellow
Add 3 cups sugar and mix well
¼ t. lemon extract
Dash of salt
1 tablespoon vanilla

Add by hand:
1 pint heavy cream
About ½ to ¾ gallon whole milk. Use the mark in your freezer to the fill line.

Follow directions on your freezer. Turn until frozen. It will be a soft serve consistency and tastes delicious!

I have eaten this recipe for 60 years and never had a problem with it.
