

To the community of Potwin, as you may or may not know, the nice warm softball season is almost upon us and it is time for all of us


to get ready for it! I would like to get a team together to represent the community of Potwin.

Methodist Church. It will be an eight hour class with a noon break. CPR certification is for one year, so if you haven't taken a class in the last year or you would like to get certified you should take this class. Contents of the course include mouth-

Contents of the course include mouthto-mouth breathing, one-rescuer CPR, two-rescuer CPR, care for a choking victim who is conscious or unconscious, respiratory emergencies for babies and children, and CPR for babies and children.

A \$1.00 registration fee will be due at the Potwin City Office by February 10 so that materials for the class can be obtained. A \$5.00 fee will be charged for the book. If you are recertifing and have your book the fee will be less and it probably will not take as long to complete the class.

A LOOK BACK AT 1988

The Potwin Fire Department had a very busy year in 1988. We responded to a total of 27 runs. Of those we had 7 medical runs, 17 fire calls and 3 mutual aid calls.

Out of calls, 7 were inside the city limits with the remainder being rural. I sincerely hope that 1989 will prove to be a much slower year than last year.

Several department members also managed to complete the hazardous materials training and radiation monitoring courses that were given in El Dorada last year. We also sponsored a Basic Firemanship class which many of the Fireman completed.

We have a very challenging year ahead of us with 24 hours of hazardous material training required by the Federal Government. So please help us by keeping things as quiet as possible.

There is finally starting to be a large concern across the country about training of Volunteer and Pay Fire Fighters. Some of this training is being forced upon the Fireman while other

THE LAIRD FAMILY HISTORY

My great grandmother, Ann Maria, was born in Pennsylvania in 1852. Her parents and family moved to Polo, Illinois. James Samuel Gorman lived in Polo, Illinois. On August 10, 1871, James and Ann Maria were married. They later moved to Harvey County in Kansas. They moved from there to Brainerd, Kansas. They became parents of 14 children. There were 7 boys and 7

girls.

My great grandpa and grandma McLain lived in Urbana, Illinois where James Warren McLain was born May 3, 1869. When James was 4 years old, they moved to Tennessee. They lived there 6 years and returned to Minois. Later they moved to a farm close to Newton, Mr. & Mrs. McLains son, James Warren, married the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. James Samuel Gorman. Her name was Alice Ellen. James Warren and Alice Ellen McLain became the parents of 3 children. Nellie was born in Mulvane, Kansas, Arthur in Brainerd and Kenneth in ElDorado.

Thomas Laird was born in 1842 in lowa. He served in the civil war from 1861 to 1865. After he returned from the war he married a neighbor girl in the Scott family. They had 6 children and his wife died and he remarried. His wife was Mary Ellen Combs. They also had 6 children, one of their sons moved to Potwin and one daughter to Hunter, Kansas. One daughter widower and children moved to parts unknown. Thomas and Mary Ellen and the rest moved to Potwin in 1911 except one that moved here in 1917. Previous to this Mr. & Mrs. McLain moved to Potwin and moved into a house they built at 311 North Randall and their son James Harren moved into the house just built at 310 North Randall. That is how my ancestors all got together in Potwin.
