Well, it has been a year since I put my first recipe out there, so I am celebrating a year anniversary. I hope you have enjoyed the recipes and comments as much as I have enjoyed sharing with you. Kansas will be represented in the Super Bowl, so here are a couple of snack recipes that will be good. My sister always made the Puppy Chow and now I am making it. Hope the super bowl is fantastic and you enjoy the treats. Go Chiefs!

Puppy Chow

9 cups Chex cereal (I did half Rice Chex and half Corn Chex to be gluten free)

- 1 cup chocolate chips
- ½ cup smooth peanut butter
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 ½ cup powdered sugar
- ¼ cup butter

Measure cereal and put in large bowl. Microwave chocolate chips, peanut butter and butter on high for 1 minute. Stir then microwave 30 seconds at a time till stirring results are smooth. Stir in vanilla. Pour over cereal, stirring til coated well. (My sister had this huge Tupperware bowl with a lid, so she always mixed the cereal with the powdered sugar in it, but I have to do the plastic bag thing) Pour into a plastic bag, add powdered sugar, seal and shake to coat all the cereal. Spread on wax paper to cool, then store in covered container.

Bacon Ranch Cheddar Pinwheels

8 oz cream cheese, softened

¼ cup ranch dressing

½ cup finely shredded cheddar cheese

6 pieces bacon, cooked and chopped

1 tablespoon minced chive or green onion

6 small or 3 large flour tortillas

In a small bowl, combine cream cheese and ranch dressing. Mix til smooth. Stir in cheddar cheese, bacon and chives. Spread in a generous layer over tortillas. Roll tortillas and refrigerate ½ hour, then slice into 1-inch pieces.

Fay Eugene Fry aka Father, Dad, Brother, G, G Pa, Granpa and Pops August 31, 1935 – December 16, 2019

Fay Eugene Fry came into this world on August 31, 1935. He was the youngest of 5 children born to Chris and Melinda Fry. His sisters and brothers, Mary, Alvin, Elmer and Lafern were, from all accounts, overjoyed with their little brother. In fact, Mary and Lafern were the ones who named him. He grew up in Hutchinson, Yoder and rural Reno County as well as Mulberry and Mountainburg, Arkansas.

Fay conquered many obstacles in life. At an early age, he contracted Polio but with care defeated it, leaving him with a slight limp as its only memory. After completing 6th grade, he decided he had enough of school and upon returning from Arkansas he enrolled himself in 8th grade at Sherman Middle School in Hutchinson, KS. Yep, he skipped 7th grade in an effort to make it to 9th grade quicker so he could drop out. He never got the chance to drop out, as his brother Elmer made him spend his summer earning on school clothes and enroll in the 10th grade. Skipping the 7th grade did allow him to graduate high school at 16. At 17, he was injured in a work place accident when a piece of wood struck him in the neck and exploded; that life event sent him to KU Medical Center for 3 years where he had many surgeries before he recovered.

Fay's greatest passion was definitely his family. In 1959, he married his lifelong love Colleen Faye Hensley. They were married just short of 56 years when Colleen passed from this world. Fay and Colleen loved to travel and for many summers you could find them in a converted Jewel T delivery truck traveling around the Southwest regions of the United States with their kids and family members camping alongside the road, in rest areas, lakes and many of the greatest views available in the Southwest.

His career in education started at Humboldt Elementary, in Humboldt, KS, in the fall of 1960. In 1961, he and Colleen welcomed their daughter Lesa into this world. Summer of 1962 found Fay, Colleen and Lesa returning to Hutchinson, KS to be closer to family. In 1963, just after the birth of their son Brian, he took a teaching position at Benton Elementary School in Benton, KS as an 8th grade English teacher, bus driver and 8th grade sponsor. He also worked summers for Circle school district during the expansion of the Benton Elementary school building. During his tenure at Benton Elementary he was part of the team that designed Chapter 1 reading in the state of Kansas. In 1972, the Fry family moved to Potwin, KS where Fay took over as the building administrator at Potwin Elementary School and stayed there for the remainder of his career.

Fay had a lifelong passion for motorcycles and race cars. In 1958, Fay rode his 1953 Harley to Daytona Beach, Florida for the last races run on the beach. He then rode cross country to Arizona where he visited his sister Mary (Chapin) Fry then headed on out to California and visited Santa Catalina Island. Upon leaving California he headed back to Hutchinson, KS then ventured to South Dakota for the Black Hills Rally and motorcycle races before returning home to work for the local Harley-Davidson dealer and Cessna Aircraft. Saturday nights you could find him and his bride at one of the local dirt tracks enjoying the evening's display of speed and sometimes mayhem.

There will be a celebration of life for Fay on January 25, 2020 at the Potwin Methodist Church in Potwin, KS. The celebration will start at 11 am. Please come celebrate him, not mourn him, as he is now with his bride and they are both smiling. Burial will be a family affair on April 12, 2020.

Fay is preceded in passing by his bride Colleen Faye (Hensley) Fry; sisters, Mary Chapin, Lafern Wright; brother, Elmer Fry. Fay is survived by his brother Alvin, his daughter Lesa Willis (Robert) of Potwin and son Brian Fry of rural Whitewater, KS. Granddaughters Angela Stout (Jonathon), Robyn Frye (Jeremy) and Jessica Shaver (Lucas) as well as 5 great grandbabies: Clark Shaver, Alexander Stout, Katherine Frye, Chloe Shaver and Evelynn Frye.
