

Ann Brackenridge led the Flag Salute and Anna McLaughlin led 4-H Pledge. Roll call was "What is your favorite sport?" was answered for each 4-Her by their parents and 14 members were present.

Detailed February Minutes were read by Mindy Amend and accepted as read. Brett Klingenberg provided the Treasurer's Report.

The leader's report was given and Debora Classen shared for members that have completed YQCA to print completion certificates as the vendor is changing. Each 4-Her that has animals has to complete YQCA. April birthday was celebrated with singing *Happy Birthday* to Cora Brackenridge. Other announcements included that Ron McCune will help halter break or other help needed with beef project, bucket calves will not have an EID tag, because of shortages, but will have an ear tag. A thank you was read from the Butler County Extension team for the toys given by the 4-Hers for the Butler County Christmas Toy Drive. The meeting was adjourned to an educational and entertaining program. Jill Harder presented an illustrated talk on how agriculture knowledge opens up many career opportunities. She shared details on her 6-month internship at Walt Disney World Animal Kingdom. She worked with the elephants and observed behaviors and how they interacted with each other and their environment. Bonnie Brewer provided Tips and Tricks from a Foods Judge. Key insights shared were to chill the ingredients for a piecrust, have fresh ingredients, and for baking pans grease using a paper towel with Crisco. One of her questions was, "How does she prepare to eat all the food when judging?" she answered that she eats mostly protein the day before, a light breakfast day-of and only takes small bites. Luke Amend provided a demonstration on How to Change a Bicycle Tire. The 4-Her's were very attentive in observing his tire changing tools, especially his small air pump that fits under a bicycle seat. A trick he shared to easily replace an inner tube is to slightly inflate it before putting it into the tire. Kiley Miller did a talent and she got her guitar out and played *On Top of Spaghetti*, and Hudson Harder did the big Achoo! Lastly Kiley played one of the best songs for Kansans to sing, *Home on the Range*!

Refreshments were enjoyed by the attendees and provided by the Brett Klingenberg and Grant Klingenberg families.



FREDERIC REMINGTON AREA HISTORICAL SOCIETY TOUR

You are invited to join the Frederic Remington Area Historical Society on a tour to learn about the ancient city of Etzanoa on Saturday, May 7. Etzanoa, which is believed to have had a population of 20,000 people in 1600, was located near Arkansas City, KS and may have been the largest prehistoric Native American city in the U.S. and Canada.

We will meet at the Cherokee Strip Land Rush Museum outside Arkansas City (the address is 31639 US Highway 77) at 10:00 am. We will watch a film on the history of Etzanoa and then visit three sites, including the confluence of the Arkansas and Walnut rivers, the battlefield and chief's lodge. These are sites where excavations have uncovered artifacts of Etzanoa. The tour is approximately 2.5 hours and does not consist of a lot of walking; mostly standing. We will follow the tour guide in our own vehicles to the site locations. Water and bug spray are recommended. Participants will also have the opportunity to visit the museum.

The fee for the tour is \$10 per person unless you are a member of the Frederic Remington Area Historical Society. The Frederic Remington Area Historical Society will cover the cost of the tour for members and their family. It's not too late to become a member of FRAHS. Membership is \$5 for an individual or \$10 for a family.

April is on the way. I'm so glad it is warming up, except for the blizzard up north! Charlie at least got his potatoes planted on St. Patrick's Day, which is a first in a few years. Spring break has been a good time. The grandkids came and hunted for gold that the leprechauns hid. I'm sure getting back into the swing of school will be a challenge after the week off. I found a quick Chimichanga recipe that you cook in the oven and was very good. So hopefully you'll be able to utilize it.

Chimichangas

Filling Ingredients:

½ t. salt
1 pound lean ground beef (or 1 lb chicken breast cut into bite size pieces.)
1 clove garlic, crushed
1 teaspoon ground cumin
1 teaspoon oregano, crushed or dried
¼ cup canned chopped green chilies
¼ cup bottled taco sauce
¼ cup sour cream
2 tablespoons cider vinegar

Directions:

Sprinkle salt in medium skillet, place over medium heat. Add beef, garlic, and spices. Cook, crumbling with fork until meat loses its pink color. Stir in remaining filling ingredients.

½ cup butter, melted
6 seven-inch tortillas

Dip tortillas in and out of melted butter, drain.

Toppings

1 (4 oz. package shredded cheese)
½ cup sour cream
½ cup bottled taco sauce
1 ½ cups shredded lettuce
1 ripe avocado, sliced (optional)

Mound a rounded 1/3 cup filling in center of tortilla. Fold envelope fashion and place seam side down in ungreased 9x11 pan. Bake in 500 degree oven for 5-10 minutes, until crispy. Sprinkle cheese on top and return to oven until cheese melts. Add toppings.

I don't know about you, but after I eat Mexican food, I always want something chocolate. This is probably a recipe you have, but it is easy and you don't have to wait to frost it.

Chocolate Sheet Cake:

2 cups sugar	2 cups flour	½ cup buttermilk or sour milk
1 teaspoon vanilla	2 eggs	1 teaspoon cinnamon
4 tablespoons cocoa	1 stick butter	½ cup shortening
1 cup cold water	1 teaspoon baking soda	¼ teaspoon salt

Sift flour and sugar together in a large bowl. Mix cocoa, butter, shortening, and water in a pan and bring to a boil. Pour over flour mixture and beat well. Add rest of ingredients and mix. Bake in grease and floured cookie sheet pan @375 degree oven for 20 minutes. 5 minutes before cake is done, make **frosting**.

Frosting:

1/3 cup milk	4 tablespoons cocoa	1 stick butter
1 teaspoon vanilla	1 cup chopped nuts	1 pound powdered sugar


Place milk, cocoa, and butter in pan. Bring to boil. Add vanilla, nuts, sugar and beat til mixed well. Pour over hot cake.


