

First off, I must apologize for my incomplete Best Peanut Butter cookie recipe. I forgot to list the 3 cups flour as one of the ingredients. This was in the July newsletter. Someone just now pointed it out to me, so hopefully if you made these cookies, you added flour.

Well, I have really enjoyed the cooler weather, and my air conditioner has enjoyed it also. I've been trying to find simple recipes and found this in an old cookbook. If you like meatloaf, you will like this (on top of the stove) version. It will be a change from turkey.

Mini-Meatloaf Patties - makes 4 patties

1 pound ground beef Salt and pepper

1 – 8 ounce can tomato sauce

2 tablespoons brown sugar

1 teaspoon prepared mustard

½ cup breads crumbs

2 tablespoons chopped onion

1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce

Combine ground beef, breadcrumbs, salt and pepper. Shape meat into patties and brown in a skillet. Depending on how lean your hamburger is, you might have to add a tablespoon of oil. Drain off excess fat. Mix tomato sauce, onion, brown sugar, Worcestershire sauce and mustard. Pour over the patties that have been browned and simmer 10 minutes with a lid on, then serve. I baked a potato in the microwave and opened a can of green beans and had supper in less than 30 minutes!

Well, if you want a different twist on pumpkin for the holidays, here it is! I love to use nuts in anything, so this was a keeper for me. Charlie said it tastes just like pumpkin pie, but you don't have to bother with pie crust. Add whipped cream if you want. Happy Thanksgiving!!

Pumpkin Dessert

Crust:

1 package yellow cake mix.

½ cup melted butter

1 egg

Reserve 1 cup of cake mix for the topping. Mix the rest of ingredients and press mixture into a 9x13 pan.

Filling:

1 pound can pumpkin1 teaspoon cinnamon½ cup packed brown sugar½ teaspoon ginger2 eggs, beaten¼ teaspoon cloves2/3 cup milk½ teaspoon salt

Topping:

1 cup cake mix mixture

1/4 cup butter

¼ cup sugar

½ cup chopped walnuts

1 teaspoon cinnamon

Mix pumpkin, sugar, eggs, milk, and spices; pour over crust. Combine reserved cake mix, sugar, cinnamon, butter with pastry cutter. Add nuts. Crumble together and sprinkle over pumpkin. Bake at 350 degree oven for 40 minutes.


