



Well, it is almost Super Bowl Day already! Of course, we have Valentine's Day, President's Day, my twin brothers' birthdays, my sister's birthday...you get the idea. I celebrate all through February. I found this easy recipe that I'm calling Baked Italian Dish and hope you like it.

Baked Italian Dish

1 pound hamburger, browned and drained of grease.

1 pound of pasta (spaghetti, penne, or ziti, etc.) cooked

1 cup ricotta cheese

1 8-ounce bar of cream cheese, softened

½ cup sour cream

1 jar spaghetti sauce (about 32 ounces)

½ cup each mozzarella and cheddar cheeses

1 stick butter

Spray a 9x13 pan with vegetable spray (unless using stoneware). Place half the pasta in the bottom of the pan. Slice half the butter and layer on top of pasta. Blend together cream cheese, ricotta cheese and sour cream. Spread over pasta layer, then add other half of pasta. Use rest of butter to layer on top of pasta. Pour sauce over top of pasta and bake in 350 degree oven for 40-45 minutes. Take out of oven and sprinkle the cheeses on top. Return to oven and bake until cheeses melt, 5-10 minutes more.

I have been craving peanut butter <u>anything</u> and found this peanut butter cake recipe that even Charlie liked. He's usually not much on peanut butter cookies, but he really liked this cake.

Peanut Butter Sheet Cake

2 cups flour 2 cups sugar

1 teaspoon baking soda 1 teaspoon baking powder

1/2 cup milk 2 eggs 1 teaspoon vanilla 1 cup water

½ cup butter ½ cup vegetable oil ½ cup peanut butter

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease a 10x14 rimmed cookie sheet. To make the cake, whisk the dry ingredients together in a large mixing bowl. Beat the milk, eggs, and vanilla into flour mixture. Place water, butter, oil, and peanut butter into a saucepan; cook and stir over medium heat until smooth, about 5 minutes. Stir peanut butter mixture into flour mixture until batter is well mixed. Batter will be very thin. Pour into prepared baking sheet. Bake in preheated oven until a toothpick inserted into the center of the cake comes out clean, about 20 minutes. (I used my metal rimmed cookie sheet pan and ended up with a lopsided cake; very thin on one side and thicker on the other side. I forgot that I usually use my stoneware sheet pan when I make a sheet cake and it bakes evenly.)

Frosting:

½ cup butter ½ cup chunky peanut butter ½ cup milk

1 teaspoon vanilla 3-4 cups powdered sugar (depends on what consistency you like)

Melt butter and peanut butter in a saucepan over medium heat; stir until smooth, of course if you use chunky peanut butter, allow for peanut chunks. Mix in milk and vanilla until combined. Whisk in powdered sugar until smooth. Pour icing over warm cake.
