

Graduations! Mother's Day! Memorial Day! Lots of things happening this month to celebrate with food! I found a Skillet Lasagna recipe that is easy and won't heat up the house. I know it is starting to get warm, and we are looking for quick recipes so we are not slaving over a hot stove or have the oven on, heating up the house.

<u>Skillet Lasagna</u>

6 ounces dry campanelle (trumpet-shaped) pasta, uncooked (I used Trio Italiano pasta, but I think any pasta you have on hand would work) ¾ pound Italian pork sausage links, casings removed (I used 1 pound hamburger instead) Half a large onion, chopped 1 teaspoon minced garlic 1 can or jar (24 oz) meat flavored pasta sauce

- 2 cups shredded mozzarella cheese
- Salt and pepper to taste

Cook pasta. Cook sausage or hamburger in skillet with onion and garlic until meat is crumbled and no longer pink. Drain the grease off the meat. Return meat to skillet and blend in pasta sauce; simmer 5 minutes. Remove from skillet. (I had drained the pasta, so just put the meat sauce in the pot the pasta was in.)

Drain pasta. Place half of pasta in bottom of skillet. Pour half of sauce mixture over pasta; sprinkle with 1 cup cheese. Top with remaining pasta, sauce mixture and cheese.

Cover; cook over medium heat 5 minutes or until hot and cheese melts. Remove from heat; let stand 1 minute.

With celebrations coming, maybe you would like an easy dessert that looks fancy. That is Fresh Fruit Pizza! You can make it look like you would like and depending on the fruit you use, you can do it in the school's colors for graduation or red, white and blue for Memorial Day!

Fresh Fruit Pizza	Optional Glaze	
Sugar cookie dough 8 ounce cream cheese, softened 1 tablespoon 1/3 cup sugar	1 cup sugar 2 tablespoons cornstarch ¾ cup water 1 cup orange juice	HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY!

Assorted fruit: kiwi, strawberry, blueberries, grapes, mandarin oranges, pineapple

Spread refrigerated cookie dough on pizza pan and bake in 375 degree oven for 10-15 minutes, or until done. Mix cream cheese, milk, sugar, and vanilla together, beating til smooth. Spread over the top of cooled, baked cookie dough, then decorate with fruit of choice. The glaze should be mixed together well, then poured sparingly over the pizza. Refrigerate until ready to slice and serve. Enjoy your holidays this month. LaVonne Baker


May 1, 2023 – "Living on the Main Line – Railroads as Creators and Builders of Community" by Donald Skinner Remington High School, 8850 NW Meadowlark, Whitewater. 7:00 PM

Donald Skinner, author of a new history of Peabody on its 150th anniversary, describes the role of railroads—the Santa Fe and the Rock Island—in creating that community and enabling it to thrive.

In the late 1800s, as Marion and Butler counties were being settled, a railroad meant everything. Men, who were looking for a place to create a town, went to great lengths to ensure their prospective community would be in the path of a coming railroad. A railroad would provide a way to ship agricultural produce and to stock the grocery and hardware stores. But more than that, a railroad brought the cultural influences of the outside world to town. In a time before good roads, railroads brought big-city newspapers and a great variety of musical and theatrical performers and forum speakers, not to mention the occasional circus and political candidate. The Santa Fe also brought Frederic Remington to town. Its role in the Mennonite migration is well-known.

Don, a retired journalist, grew up in Peabody and now lives in Overland Park. His book, <u>Light Up the Sky, Peabody at</u> <u>150</u>, was published in 2021.
